

Over 25 transcripted college courses are currently offered to ETHS students in addition to brand new coursework that has been approved for the upcoming 2021-22 school year.




Our students K-12 did a fantastic job collaborating with the East Troy Chamber of Commerce in their presentation of the 2020 ET Lights Show.



Prairie View students continue to foster community relationships from a distance such as sending Valentine cards to residents at The Heritage.



CAPITAL & OPERATIONAL REFERENDA: PLEASE VOTE

The East Troy Community School District is proposing two questions to voters on the April 6, 2021 ballot. The following information is intended to explain more about each question.



QUESTION 1:OPERATIONAL REFERENDUM

The non-recurring, five-year operational referendum would provide \$8 million over the next five years to address projected budget gaps.

WHY?

The state funding formula (called the Revenue Limit or Revenue Cap) limits what any Wisconsin school district can collect in revenue. It affects all school districts differently, but over the past ten years approximately 87% of school districts* have sought additional revenue through referendums.

In East Troy, like many school districts, state aid and local revenues are not keeping pace with costs. After 14 years of budget-balancing efforts, the District has come to a critical point where it no longer can sustain current programs, services, and staff.

HOW WILL THIS IMPACT LEARNING?

The operational referendum seeks voter approval to exceed the revenue limit to maintain current:

- Educational programs
- Student services
- Class sizes
- · Staffing levels

If the referendum is not approved, the District must annually make significant reductions to programming, services, and staff.

QUESTION 2: CAPITAL REFERENDUM

The capital bond referendum would provide the district with \$8 million to address high-priority maintenance, building safety, and infrastructure needs.

WHY?

An essential responsibility of the Board of Education is to properly maintain the facilities and grounds of the School District within the annual operating budget. When costs for major repairs and replacements of equipment exceed what a limited budget can handle without sacrificing educational programming, the Board of Education may seek voter approval for a capital referendum. An approved capital referendum gives the Board authority to borrow money for specific projects.

The Capital Referendum, if approved allows:



WHAT'S AT STAKE?

Without approval of the two referendum questions, the District will not be able to maintain educational programming and services, staffing, or address high-priority building repairs and replacements.



The non-recurring Operational Referendum requests funds to address the compounded projected budget shortfall.



Estimated Tax Increase If BOTH Referendum Questions Are Approved

Assessed Property Value	Estimated ANNUAL Tax Increase	Estimated MONTHLY Tax Increase
\$100,000	\$94	\$7.84
\$200,000	\$188	\$15.67
\$300,000	\$282	\$23.50
\$400,000	\$376	\$31.34

If both questions are approved, the estimated mill rate tax increase is \$0.94 per \$1,000 of equalized property value.

Open Enrollment

The 2021-22 regular open enrollment period is February 3, 2021 - April 30, 2021

What is public school open enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live.

Who may participate in open enrollment?

Pupils in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment. Open enrollment for prekindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school district to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment in other districts.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2021-22 school year is from February 3 through April 30, 2021. Application forms and additional information can be found on the Wisconsin DPI website at *www.dpi.wi.gov*.

My family just moved to East Troy. How do I enroll my child?

Students who reside within the boundaries of the district may enroll anytime by visiting our district website or by contacting the building in which they will be attending.
