REGISTRATION

Summer school registration will be completed online (instructions on page 18). Online registration will open April 8 at 6:00am and close at the end of the day on April 19. <u>Due to the limited number of courses being offered, we expect all courses to reach capacity very quickly. Students will be registered on a first come, first served basis.</u>

ATTENDANCE

Due to the short duration of the summer school program, attendance at all classes is very important. Students are expected to attend on a regular basis. If you have a vacation planned, however, your child may still register and attend summer school. Students in HS For-Credit Courses may not exceed 3 absences (reference Board Policy 431). If a student will be absent, please call the appropriate building's office (see attendance contacts on page 2), following the same procedures as the academic school year.

COURSE CANCELLATIONS

Classes without sufficient enrollment by April 19 will be cancelled and fees will be refunded.

COURSE FEES

NON-RESIDENT TUITION FEE

LUNCH/SNACKS

Students may bring appropriate snacks from home to eat during breaks. Lunch/snacks will not be provided by the district.

BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Before/after school care will NOT be provided for the 2024 summer school session. Students will be expected to be dropped off shortly before classes begin and picked up immediately following the conclusion of classes either via district transportation or parent/guardians. The District is not responsible for supervising students once they leave the buildings.

FOR-CREDIT: HUMAN GEOGRAPHY A

Why do different countries speak different languages? Why are religions practiced in some regions of the world, but not others?

The Human Geography course will study patterns of humans (and how we are influenced by geography and how geography influences humans). While historians use time to explain the world, human geographers use space (not outer space). Human geography is the study of history, religion, politics, economics, sociology, psychology, and other sciences, but through a spatial perspective. This course aims to deepen a student's understanding of the world and how its people interact within it.

I AM NEW TO THE DISTRICT AND/OR FORGOT MY USERNAME AND/OR PASSWORD FOR FAMILY ACCESS. HOW DO I GET MY LOGIN INFORMATION?

All parents of active students have a Family Access account. If you forgot your login or password, or are new to the district, click on "Forgot your login or password?" and click on "Submit". If your email address matches what the district has on file, you will be sent an email containing your login and a link that can be used to reset your account. Be sure that your spam/junk filter is set to allow emails from do.not.reply@easttroy.k12.wi.us. The school district must have a matching email address on file for you to receive this log on information. HOW MANY CLASSES CAN MY CHILD TAKE?

Summer school is a three period day for those in grades 4K - 8th. Students may choose three different classes unless they enroll in a class that is more than one period in length. Students may enroll in less than three classes but parents must provide transportation. Students with a partial schedule must leave the school building at the end of their classes. The District is not responsible for supervising students once they leave the buildings. In order to ride the bus to and from summer school, the student must have a full schedule.

WHAT GRADE LEVEL DO I REGISTER MY CHILD?

Students must register for classes at the grade level they are currently in for the 2023-24 school year.

HOW DO I REGISTER HOMESCHOOL, PAROCHIAL, OR NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS?

HOW DO I MAKE CHANGES TO MY CHILD'S MEDICAL ALERT INFORMATION?

You cannot make changes to your child's medical alert information. Contact health services directly at 262-642-6760 x5200 to request any medical changes.

I HAVE JOINT CUSTODY OF MY CHILD(REN). WHY CAN I NOT MAKE CHANGES TO THEIR DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION?

Only members listed as "Family 1" will be able to make changes to your child's demographic information and make payments via Family Access. Other joint custody parents may view the info and contact their child's school to make additions/corrections to a child's contact info. Joint custody parents may also send check or money order to their child's school office to make a payment.

"Family 2" members can only make changes to their own information via Family Access.

HOW DO I PRINT MY STUDENT'S SCHEDULE?

Click the "Arena Scheduling" tab and then "View/Print Schedule". To print a schedule, click "Print Schedule". You may also click the "Schedule" tab. Class confirmations and schedules will not be sent out to families.
