

Back in October, the Prairie View fourth graders took a field trip to hike the Stony Ridge Segment (3.5 miles) of the Ice Age Trail.



Strategic Priority #1 - Learner Empowerment

Support conditions for learner empowerment







Our East Troy High School held a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new CNA lab which provides students with the opportunity to earn their Certified Nursing Assistant certifications from a Gateway Technical College instructor on our own school campus.

Learner Empowerment Seen Through Exemplary Career & College Readiness

Throughout all K-12 grade levels, our District strives to empower students in their learning through student voice and choice. From the beginning, this priority allows students to choose where they learn in flexible spaces, how they learn with available tools and technology, and what they are learning with numerous electives, career pathways, and opportunities for work experience, apprenticeships, and college credit.

In order to provide choice, it is essential that our district also provides opportunities.

As seen from the most recent East Troy High School State Report Card, our district stands out among the State of Wisconsin.



- **27.8%** of our ETHS students successfully completed at least one Advanced Placement course. This is above the state average of 19.9%.
- **62.8%** of our ETHS students successfully completed at least one Dual Enrollment course. This is well above the state average of 18.6%.
- **12.9%** of our ETHS students earned at least one industry-recognized credential. This is above the state average of 2.8%.
- **5.5%** of our ETHS students participated in a work-based learning program. This is above the state average of 3.4%.

Partnerships with Tech Companies to Provide New Opportunities to ETHS Students

The opportunity for students to pursue robotics and manufacturing pathways in grades 6-12 has long been a source of pride to the district. Many students have since received industry-recognized certifications prior to graduation.

NEW for the 2023-24 school year will be the opportunity for ETHS students to pursue Advanced Manufacturing through the course "Intro to Industrial Control Systems." The district plans to partner with companies such as CalTech to provide real life connections as well as additional certifications.

...of responding ETHS students were involved in extra-curriculars such as sports, clubs, theater, band/choir, etc. during the 22-23 school year.

Our Middle School Advanced Learners took 1st place overall at the Southern Lakes Advanced Learner Network Regional Academic Bowl in the areas of Language, Math, Science, and Social Studies.



The East Troy Advanced Learners Program provides opportunities and learning experiences for elementary

and middle school students that allow them to develop and grow at a pace that matches their abilities.



INNOVATION LAE

The Innovation Lab at Prairie View Elementary was specifically designed as a space for students to create their own unique projects to display a skill or standard that was learned previously in other subjects. This allows students in grades 3-5 to have voice and choice in their assessments.

Student Surveys

97% of responding 4th-5th grade students felt that their teachers made learning fun and interesting.

74% of responding 6th-8th grade students felt they were provided many opportunities for choice and voice in determining how to represent their learning.

92% of responding 9th-12th grade students felt they knew how well they were doing in their classes throughout the course of the year.

Strategic Priority #2 - Cultivate a Healthy Organizational Culture

Cultivate a healthy organizational culture that supports learning through the values of: relationships and trust, communications, commitments, ongoing learning (growth mindset), voice, joy/happiness, compassion, gratefulness, self-reflection, feedback, accountability, and results.

Staff Surveys

East Troy is a great place to LEARN and a great place to WORK. Therefore, gaining staff feedback is important in order to promote and maintain a healthy organizational culture.

Here are a few results:



100% of responding 3rd-5th grade staff feel their work has purpose.

100% of responding 3rd-5th grade staff feel like they are making progress.

100% of responding 3rd-5th grade staff feel respected and supported by their collegues.

100% of responding 4K-5th grade staff feel they have the resources needed to effectively carry out their responsibilities.

92% of responding 6th-8th grade staff feel appreciated by the community.

65% of responding staff district-wide feel that the benefits they receive are fair compared to others in their profession.


Out of approx 135 licensed staff for the 2023-24 school year, 58 hold a Master's Degree or higher, and 10 hold National Board Certifications.

Each year our licensed staff participates in over 85 hours of professional development focused on assessments, the use of data, literacy skills, and practices that address learner empowerment.

District-Wide Length of Employment



Since the 2017-18 school year, the district has tracked staff retention data for the administration, licensed staff, and paraprofessional positions. The graph above shows the length of employment prior to staff members leaving the district. **The average length of employment is 7.85 years.** This is above the national average of 4.1 years, according to a report from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in the fall of 2022.

Love & Logic Training Benefits Students, Staff, and Parents

Love & Logic provides research-based strategies for parents and educators to build caring and respectful relationships with children of all ages. During the 22-23 school year, Love & Logic training was provided to district staff, as well as parents/guardians within our community.

100% of responding parent participants agreed that Love & Logic techniques have positively impacted their child's behavior.

88% of responding parent participants agreed that the Love & Logic course has improved their parenting techniques.

Strategic Priority #3 - Increased Communication & Engagment

Maximize the value of our educational institution via families that attend ETCSD as well as the greater East Troy community through increased communication and engagement.

Speak Up, Speak Out

Recently the district has transitioned to the SPEAK UP, SPEAK OUT Resource Center for thier comprehensive, onestop place to turn with important concerns. They also provide the district with an effective Threat Reporting System, Threat Assessment Consultation, Critical Incident Response and General School Safety Guidance.

The district has worked with local law enforcement in order to make this transition for the safety of our students, staff, and community.





Good Neighbor of the Year Award

The East Troy Community School District was very pleased to be presented with the 2023 Good Neighbor of the Year Award by the East Troy Area Chamber of Commerce. This award recognizes a person, an organization, or company that has made a significant positive impact in our community and has worked collaboratively with the East Troy Area Chamber of Commerce. Recipients of the award are chosen for the ways in which they enhance the East Troy area's image as a community, exemplify community leadership, practice civic involvement, and participate in community volunteerism.

At the October School Board meeting, the SmartLab, Computer Science, Construction, and Advanced Manufacturing programs were highlighted.

Several elementary and middle school students were present to voice their own unique perspectives on these programs.



Parent & Community Surveys Providing opportunities for

Providing opportunities for parents/guardians and community members to share their voice with the East Troy Community School District is essential. Parent and community surveys are an effective way to collect important feedback.

During the fall of 2022, several surveys were offered to parents, as well as to the greater community. Here are a few results:



100% of responding 4K-2nd grade parents agreed that Little Prairie staff is caring and supportive.

100% of responding 4K-2nd grade parents agreed that their child enjoys going to school on most days.

95.3% of responding 4K-2nd grade parents agreed that Little Prairie has high expectations regarding learning for their child(ren).

99.4% of responding 4K-2nd grade parents agreed that their student has positive connections with classmates.

79.4% of responding 4K-12th grade parents think that communications from the District are "Great" or "Good".

90% of responding 4K-12th grade parents believe that the district is right to focus on the 6 C's for learning (Creativity, Critical Thinking, Collaboration, Communication, Content, and Curiosity)

Facebook remains the largest online influence for our district with 2355 current followers (approx 28% increase since February 2021), and an *average reach of 11,672 accounts per month*.

Strategic Priority #4 - Good Steward of District Resources

Ensure the district continues to act as a good steward of district resources toward fostering and supporting our mottos, other strategic areas, and district goals.



Annual Board Meeting September 25 | 6:00pm | ETHS Library

We welcome all community members to participate in the Annual Board Meeting by either attending in-person or viewing on our district YouTube channel. The district's Annual Report will be presented in order to review our administration, demographics, academic performance, successes and achievements, partnerships, community outreach, and financials of the 2022-23 School Year.

In addition to serving as an accountability piece, this report helps to further the district's efforts to raise awareness of the work being done and give our stakeholders a snapshot of what we are able to accomplish with the resources and support provided to us. A preliminary 2023-24 budget will also be provided in the annual report and presented at the annual meeting.

Recent Updates on the District Budget

The district budget is a fluid and ongoing projection that is consistently updated throughout the fiscal year. Updates are presented at board meetings, and all financial information is also available on our district website.

Below are a few pieces of information that were recently discussed:

- Despite the recent State Budget providing more funding for schools, the State Revenue still falls short of inflation, increased needs for specialized services, and our growing facility maintenance needs. The Per Pupil Revenue Limit has been increased \$325 but the Joint Finance Committee shared that approximately a \$400 increase would be necessary to align with inflation.
- Currently, budget models predict a \$765,000 deficit in 2025-26 with the deficit increasing drastically in years beyond 2025-26. Therefore, the district is diligent in our planning by prioritizing a healthy fund balance, weighing budget and staffing decisions very carefully, and always exploring additional savings and revenue options.
- At the July board meeting, we highlighted the Benefits, Salaries, and Facilities sub-committees that are being formed. These committees will work to ensure fiscal responsibility while also aligning with other strategic priorities such as retaining quality staff and providing a comfortable environment for the learners and staff members which contributes to an overall healthy organizational culture.
- As highlighted in the April 24th board meeting, the district and Board of Education worked diligently towards adopting a lower health insurance option and continue to explore cost saving options regarding district benefits. Specifically, our retiree health insurance policy and a Health Insurance plan that incorporates Health Savings Accounts are being researched.
- Likewise, staffing for 2023-24 was carefully evaluated and some reconfigurations ensured that budget dollars will be efficiently utilized to meet student needs.

Thanks to Mr. Hoff and Mr. Mass, our ETHS Tech Department received a **\$9600 VOICE mini grant** that will be used to purchase equipment that is needed for students



to earn Precision Measurement Certifications through Starret and Snap-on.

Our East Troy Community School District received the **2022 Safety, Security & Wellness Award** from the Wisconsin Association of School Business Officials. The purpose of the Safety, Security & Wellness Award is to recognize and promote Wisconsin school districts for their efforts in creating safe and healthy learning environments for students and staff.





Our ETHS was approved for 61 incentive grant claims as a result of our students receiving various CTE (Career & Technical Education) certifications during the 2021-22 school year. These grants totaled \$51,479.73 and went towards our CTE programs, including the creation of the CNA Lab which provides students the opportunity to earn their Certified Nursing Assistant certifications from a Gateway Technical College instructor on our own school campus.

Grants from the 2022-23 school year are currently being processed.
